Fiscal Year 2012 Budget Workshop

@10:07:47 a.m., Commissioner Malone called a meeting to order in the Commissioners Chambers. Commissioners Durgan and Malone were present. Also present were Lani Hartung, finance; Ed Hillman road; Philip Fletcher, community development; and Minutes Clerk John Mueller. No public comment made.

The meeting was scheduled as a Fiscal Year 2012 budget workshop.

Finance Director Lani Hartung said she adjusted the payroll distribution spreadsheet per wage changes in effect currently and adjusted permissible medical levy and revenue budget lines since the last meeting per Commission directive. Hartung said the director of environmental health asked to move the Floodplain Administration budget from the Community Development Department to the Sanitarian's budget in the general fund.

There was discussion about reducing transfers-in or decreasing expenditures for the Sheriff's Office budget. The Commission addressed a Fleshman Creek Restoration Project budget and funds to cover the county's share for a preliminary engineering report. The Commission lowered Clerk of Court reserves below 33 percent.

County Road Updates

@9:07:50 a.m., Commissioner Malone called a meeting to order in the Commissioners Chambers. Commissioners Durgan and Malone were present. Also present were Ed Hillman road; Raea Morris, administrative assistant; Kevin Bales, Crazy Mountain Ranch; Charles Hansburg, attorney; Chad Yoakam, citizen; Pete Adams and Allan Lutes, PCSO; and Minutes Clerk John Mueller.

The meeting was scheduled to discuss county road issues.

Commissioner Malone said Mark Westenskow of CTA Engineering viewed Rock Creek Road last week who said the road has a thin asphalt surface that has been patched. Westenskow said questions exist about the condition of the road base, as well as site distance in part because of a canal. Road Supervisor Ed Hillman said he thinks everyone agrees merely an overlay of the road will not suffice, but the base needs to be rebuilt. Westenskow said CTA would contract with Geo Tech to determine the integrity of the road base at regular intervals and identify drainage patterns.

Attorney Charles Hansbury of Garlington, Lohn and Robinson said money is still available in Crazy Mountain Ranch's Rock Creek Road budget. He said the ranch needs an estimate of full engineering for the road for review this calendar year before a bid is gone out for. He said the ranch would like all preliminary work completed in time to conduct the road work in the spring. Hansbury said an estimate will enable a determination of what work can be done over a period of time and asked if the county has the funds to front a million-dollar project until the ranch pays back the county over a three-year period after a contract amendment and extension through the upcoming year. He said a promissory note from Philip Morris will be drafted in order to pay back funds to the county, and Philip Morris will ask if the funds can be repaid without interest.

Chad Yoakam of Guthrie Lane provided the Commission with a memo noting road conditions in the Five Acre Tracts as a concerned member of the neighborhood around Guthrie Lane. Yoakam said the Island Montessori School has increased traffic on Guthrie Lane, particularly causing issues in the wintertime. He said the road is currently posted at 25 MPH and that speed seems to be routinely violated. He said there was recently an accident at Guthrie and Canyon View, and people speed through an intersection at Montessori Island School intersection. Yoakam said he feels a child may be killed with the Montessori school taking kids on walks in the warm months.

Yoakam provided a list of possible remedies, including lowering the speed limit, having more frequent patrol by the Sheriff's Office, grading the roads quarterly and posting stop signs at intersections. Hillman said the speed limit cannot be changed without a traffic study. Malone said the legislature passed a law enabling the county to lower the speed limit to 25 MPH. Yoakam said 25 MPH signs are already posted and say the area is patrolled by radar. Malone said the residents can pay someone to grade the road.

Yoakam said the residents pay taxes for road maintenance. He said he understands money issues and politics, but a safety issue exists on the roads.

Commissioner Durgan said the wet weather prohibited the contract grader from grading the Five Acre Tracts roads this year. He said it is a tough situation with those roads because they roads are too narrow for county graders. Yoakam asked if the residents can collectively make an effort to rectify the issue. Malone said the residents need to meet with a Sheriff's deputy to discuss traffic patterns and advice of where to put stop signs. Hillman said he thinks a one-way street past the Montessori school road would be the best solution and he thinks the road between Guthrie and Shamrock can be made one-way travel with citizen support. Malone said the Commission will talk to the contractor to see how much it will cost the county to maintain the roads quarterly. Hillman said Shamrock Lane will have millings put down on it this year if he can get his crew together. Deputy Pete Adams left the courthouse to view the roads with Yoakam.

Hillman said the mowing crew is mowing roads today. He said Brackett Creek Road was graded from end to end three weeks ago, but many complaints were received about the road on August 22. The Commission asked Hillman to check the condition of Brackett Creek Road. Hillman said he will drive the road to check its condition.

Administrative Assistant Raea Morris said Barb Fletcher telephoned about a Commission letter to Montana FWP about a culvert on Peterson Creek. Malone said he will telephone Mrs. Fletcher.

There was discussion about whether a culvert near Jardine Road belongs to the county or the Gardiner Water District.

Discussion/Signing of Lease of County Property Agreement with Rocky Mountain RV Park and Lodging, LLC

Civil Deputy County Attorney Shannan Piccolo said the RV park decided to leave an open area as a pet relief area after initially proposing to add vehicle spots on county ground, which would have required subdivision review. Piccolo said the RV park has offered to lease the ground from Park County through a lease agreement payment of \$1,500 per year, manage weeds and erect a fence with a 10-foot easement in the event a Yellowstone River Trail issue is rectified. Piccolo said the park may plant trees and shrubs, but will not erect permanent structures.

Commissioner Durgan said the proposed lease is for a period of five years to extend from August 1, 2011, to August 1, 2016.

Citizen Phil Dawson asked if the county parks board approved the lease terms.

Commissioner Malone moved to sign the lease. Commissioner Durgan seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Discussion/Decision to Hire Temporary Position for Park County Re-Districting Project

@9:14:19 a.m., Commissioner Malone called a meeting to order in the Commissioners Chambers. Commissioners Durgan and Malone were present. Also present were Raea Morris, administrative assistant; Jill Ouellette, HR; Erica Hoffman, GIS/IT; Denise Nelson, clerk and recorder; Lani Hartung, finance; Belinda Van Nurden, DES; and Minutes Clerk John Mueller. No public comment made.

The meeting was scheduled to consider a decision to hire a temporary position for a Park County re-districting project.

GIS/IT Manager Erica Hoffman said the meeting was scheduled to discuss precinct redistricting that needs to be done with GIS Department assistance. Hoffman said the project is larger than her staff can take on and she feels a part-time hire is necessary, but a part-time employee was not budgeted in her FY 2012 budget.

Clerk and Recorder Denise Nelson said legislative and commission boundary lines have been redrawn in the past, but precinct boundary lines have not been addressed for a long time. Nelson that work needs to be done because each precinct is supposed to have a like number of residents, which currently is not the case. She said county election administrators may be required to take over school elections if such a bill is introduced in the next legislative session, which will require changes to precinct lines to match school district lines. Hoffman said it would be a benefit to have GIS layers created before such legislative changes are applied, but that work will require a lot of on-the-ground data collection. Nelson said Montana Code Annotated states such a re-districting effort is a commissioner project to be paid for by the Commission budget.

Commissioner Malone moved to permit the HR Department to commence the proper process to hire the requested part-time position. Commissioner Durgan seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Hoffman said she does not know how long the redistricting process will take and she has a desk full of GIS work to improve the county and city. She asked if the hired individual can be assigned other tasks on days with inclement weather prohibiting re-districting

fieldwork. Malone said Hoffman would have to create a separate line item from her budget for such work. Hoffman said she will schedule a meeting with the Commission to amend her budget to allow for additional work to be paid for from the GIS budget.

Discussion/Decision on Gardiner Transfer Station Compactor Site

@10:01:40 a.m., Commissioner Malone called a meeting to order in the Commissioners Chambers. Commissioners Durgan and Malone were present. Also present were Shannan Piccolo, civil deputy county attorney; Barbara Woodbury, environmental health; Mark Westenskow, CTA Engineering; and Minutes Clerk John Mueller. No public comment made.

The meeting was scheduled to consider a decision on a Gardiner refuse transfer station compactor site.

Commissioner Malone said he and Mark Westenskow of CTA Engineering viewed the current green box and county road shop site in Gardiner as a viable location to construct a refuse compactor site. Westenskow said the existing green box site is in direct line of the airport runway and the FAA may prefer an enclosed refuse facility outside of the runway line. He said the county definitely needs to conduct a topographic survey to determine adequate relief and existing infrastructure, as well as identify what additional roadway infrastructure may be necessary. He said the county also needs to conduct an environmental analysis and gain permitting through DEQ, determine access issues, individuals using the site and an appropriate design for today and into the future. Westenskow said a further step would be to prepare a Professional Engineering Report (PER) to document all issues, which will enable pursuit of other funding sources.

Westenskow provided the Commission with a cost proposal for a topographic survey, environmental analysis and preliminary engineering site analysis for a compactor facility. A second cost proposal also included preparation of a full PER.

Commissioner Durgan moved the Commission direct CTA Engineering to proceed with a topographic survey and environmental analysis not to exceed \$15,609 in order to proceed with a compactor site in Gardiner. Commissioner Malone seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Civil Deputy County Attorney Shannan Piccolo said deadlines provided by CTA's task order state the topographic survey will be included in the last week in August 2011, the

environmental analysis will be completed by September 30 and the preliminary engineering analysis work with exhibits will be completed by September 30.

Fiscal Year 2012 Budget Workshop

@10:35:33 a.m., Commissioner Durgan called a meeting to order in the Commissioners Chambers. Commissioners Durgan and Malone were present. Also present were Lani Hartung, finance; Martha Miller, auditor; PCSO personnel Gregg Todd, Allan Lutes, Tom Totland, Coleen Singer and Wendy Wood; and Minutes Clerk John Mueller. No public comment made.

The meeting was scheduled as a Fiscal Year 2012 Budget workshop.

Finance Director Lani Hartung said she reduced the commissioners' mileage travel budget for FY 2012 from \$18,000 to \$10,000, as only \$9,000 in miles were driven in FY '11.

Commissioner Durgan and Malone agreed to take \$100,000 from the Burlington Northern Capital fund to budget for the county's share of the Flesman Creek Restoration Project. The Commission addressed Forest Service RAC Title II funds and reduced the permissive medical mill levy from 13.9 to 13.6.

Wendy Wood, Search and Rescue, said last year was a good year for SAR regarding little expenditures. Wood said SAR has already had 11 missions in which every responder was paged out and over \$7,000 in rescue helicopter bills for three missions this fiscal year. Wood said, in addition, water rescues so far this year are more expensive than all of last year. Wood said she has applied for reimbursement funds, but the county may not receive full reimbursement. Wood said she had already cut \$10,000 from this year's proposed budget at the Commission's direction.

Wood said her biggest concern is aging equipment. She said SAR spent only \$46,000 from her budget last year and decided not to spend funds just because they existed in order to show the Commission it is saving pennies. Wood said the issue is how much longer that can be done before equipment must be replaced. She said the SAR boat is old with twice-re-welded seams and has an engine out of compliance with air quality standards.

Malone said his idea was to require departments to ask for additional funds and make amendments to their budgets instead of automatically putting funds into a budget that may or may not be spent. The Commission agreed to transfer-in \$15,025 into the SAR Capital Improvement budget for a new boat.

The Missouri River Drug Task Force budget was discussed and \$10,197 in revenue was transferred-in from the county's Payment in Lieu of Taxes fund.

Discussion of County Issues with Representative Rehberg Staffer

@1:02:34 p.m., Commissioner Malone called a meeting to order in the Commissioners Chambers. Commissioners Durgan and Malone were present. Also present were Will Selph, Representative Rehberg's Office; Philip Fletcher, community development; and Minutes Clerk John Mueller. No public comment made.

The meeting was scheduled to discuss county issues with a member of Representative Rehberg's staff.

Will Selph, Representative Rehberg staffer, said Representative Rehberg's Office recently hired Sam Sweeney of Belt to address agriculture issues in Washington, DC, which the office hopes will help with upcoming Farm Bill legislation. Selph said new natural resources and veterans outreach directors were hired, as well.

Selph said Rehberg and colleagues put enough pressure on Montana DOT to cease attempt to put stricter regulations on commercial drivers' licenses, which would have applied to farm equipment. Selph said Rehberg is sponsoring HR 1265 that encourages growth in small business by extending 15-year tax deductions and is co-sponsoring a bill to reregulate the Equal Access to Justice Act, which is an environmentalist's best tool making it easy to file a lawsuit and have the government pay for it. Selph said he will meet with Yellowstone National Park to discuss bison, wolves and snowmobile access. Commissioner Malone said he would like Selph to also bring up consideration of extending the time period Highway 212 is open to Cooke City throughout the year.

Selph said Rehberg is sponsoring a Kids Just Wanna Ride bill against EPA and Consumer Protection Board overreaction in regulating mercury, which affected production of ATVs for young riders.

Selph asked the Commission if it received letters of support against the Antiquities Act, which allows for designation of wilderness without Congressional approval. He said Rehberg sees a big problem with using an end around process to designate wilderness without Congress. Selph said Rehberg is sponsoring an amendment to prevent the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms from tracking and cataloguing rifles upon purchase, which Rehberg sees as a gross violation of second amendment rights. He said

Rehberg was the only member of the Congressional Delegation to vote against both President Obama's and Paul Ryan's budget plan that would have significantly cut Medicare and Medicaid funding.

Selph said Rehberg is co-sponsoring a bill to prevent U.S. dollars from bailing out Greece, as promised by President Obama, is sponsoring a bill to permanently kill the Death Tax and is sponsoring an amendment to protect state and individual water sovereignty, which was threatened by an attempt of the last Democrat-controlled Congress in allowing the Army Corps of Engineers and EPA to control any navigable body of water.

@2:00:50 p.m., Commissioner Durgan called a meeting to order in the Commissioners Chambers. Commissioners Durgan, Malone and Taylor (via telephone) were present. Also present were Shannan Piccolo, civil deputy county attorney; Barbara Woodbury, environmental health; Kim Knutson, fair; Philip Fletcher, community development; Mike Adams and Ed Flatt, fair board; Kerry Fee and Nelson King, PCEC; Wes Venteicher, Livingston Enterprise; Mike Cox, Oasis Environmental; Mark Westenskow, CTA Engineering; Kurt Thomas, Stahly Engineering; Citizens Kristen Wester, Theresa Coleman, Gillean Swanson, Larry Lahren, Myra Stein, Bill Edwards, Jeanne Souvigney and Chuck Donovan; and Minutes Clerk John Mueller.

The meeting was scheduled to consider a decision to reconsider a Commission motion to not issue a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the Fleshman Creek Project at the present time and consider a decision on issuance and content of a Fleshamn Creek Project RFQ.

Commissioner Taylor moved to reconsider sending out an RFQ for the Fleshman Creek Project. Commissioner Malone seconded the seconded. Motion passed unanimously.

Community Development Director Philip Fletcher said the project scope of services was sent to Montana DNRC last September so Park County knows exactly what that agency expects to see from the scope of services. He said the county has a scope of services that can easily be adapted into what has been recently discussed and redoing the scope of services with changes will literally take a few days. Fletcher said his opinion is the county needs to have DNRC sign off on the RFQ before distributing it. He said DNRC is usually quick in signing such things.

Mike Cox of Oasis Environmental said an alternative the county can consider is going out for an RFQ to select an engineering firm based on requested qualifications to support

similar types of projects, such as utility, stream and road crossing work. He said the county could draft a scope of work after selecting a firm, as the county does not need to have a scope of work in the RFQ to start with. He said such an effort would save time.

Taylor said he thinks it would be a good idea to have DNRC look at the scope of services before the RFQ is submitted if the process is as quick as Fletcher says. Civil Deputy County Attorney Shannan Piccolo said the Commission should have Kent Atwood of Montana Disaster and Emergency Services review the scope of services, as well.

Commissioner Malone moved that county staff write up an RFQ and provide it to Kent Atwood and Alicia Stickney (DNRC) for review and then put it out on the street as soon as possible. Commissioner Taylor seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Kristen Wester asked if the firm selected to conduct the RFQ will undergo the same stipulations with the Commission selecting two top candidates and interviewing them before selection per the recent selection of a countywide engineer. Durgan said his interpretation was the Commission had the option of interviewing the top two candidates for the countywide engineering position but felt it did not need to without a tie to break.
