Updates are released on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.

Evening Update:

- The 9th District Federal Reserve Bank and the Gardiner Chamber of Commerce are hosting a Gardiner business roundtable tomorrow, Tuesday 6/28, to collect data about the flood event's impact on businesses in Gardiner. The event begins at 10 am at the Gardiner Public School.
- Some Fishing Access Sites remain closed. Check on closures and other information about the Yellowstone River at https://fwp.mt.gov/news.
- MedCor Mammoth Mobile Clinic is operating an urgent care and walk-in medical clinic in Gardiner on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays from 8:30am - 5pm. The clinic is located inside the Yellowstone National Park boundary across from Yellowstone Forever. Call 307-344-7965 for questions or to set up an in-person or telehealth appointment.
- Yellowstone River is closed downstream of Livingston between the Hwy 89N Bridge and Sheep Mountain fishing access sites due to a downed power pole.
- Cinnabar Basin Road will be closed to all traffic from Monday, 6/27 Friday 7/01, 7am 4pm for repairs.
- Tourism Reliant Business Flood Assistance Grants have been created in response to the economic impact to tourism-reliant businesses affected by the historic flooding in Carbon, Park and Stillwater Counties. Visit https://commerce.mt.gov for more information.
- Green waste is accepted at the Chico green boxes from 10am-4pm until further notice.
- Some residences in Silver Gate continue having issues with Centurylink landline service. The issue is being worked on.
- FedEx service to Cooke City and Silver Gate has not fully resumed.
- UPS Daily deliveries are scheduled to begin Monday, 06/27/22.

- Residents who need help with flood clean up can call 2-1-1 to get connected with Crisis Cleanup teams and other resources.
- A Flood Recovery Information Guide is being distributed county wide. Digital copies can be found on the flood Facebook page as well as the Park County website.

Water Update

There are no boil advisories in effect for any water district in Park County. If you are on a private well and have questions about water safety or testing, please call the Park County Health Department 406-222-4145.

Flood Damage Form:

Flood impacted residents in Park County are strongly encouraged to **fill out a Personal Property Damage Form as soon as possible.** <u>Any flood-related</u> <u>damage, physical or economic, should be recorded</u>. The assessment form will be used to determine potential eligibility for resources from the federal or state government. The more self-assessments that can be completed, the better the state can coordinate available resources. All residents that have been impacted by the flood, regardless of the level of damage, are encouraged to fill out the self-assessment <u>here</u> or by using a camera to scan the QR code (to right). You may also call 406-222-4131 for help filling out the form.



Scams:

If you suspect anyone – an inspector, disaster survivor, or someone posing as one of these – of fraudulent activities, call the FEMA toll-free Disaster Fraud Hotline at 866- 720-5721, or Park County Sheriff's Office at 406-222-2050.

Volunteer Tracking:

It is critical that volunteer hours, donations and equipment use (pumps, hoses, skid steers, even brooms, etc.) be recorded for FEMA compliance. It is also critical that the work done is being detailed. FEMA-compliant forms for volunteer and equipment tracking can be found on Park County's flood information page at <u>https://www.parkcounty.org/Government-Departments/Emergency-Services/</u>.
