

Gardiner Flood Update 07/06/22

Highlighted information is new to this update



Park County Financial Assistance Resources: Park County has created a packet with information for individuals, homeowners and businesses on financial assistance available for flood recovery. A physical copy can be picked up at the Gardiner Chamber of Commerce. Business Recovery Center: The Small Business Administration is setting up a Business Recovery Center in Livingston at the Livingston Area Chamber (303 E Park St, Livingston MT). The center will be open Mondays through Fridays, 9am to 6pm MDT. SBA representatives will be there in-person to answer questions and help people apply for assistance.

Yellowstone River: A large hazard of concrete and rebar exists in the river at the end of the town stretch in Gardiner. **STAY RIVER LEFT.** Be alert for new hazards and obstacles, especially as water levels recede. Consider scouting your route before floating the river. The River is open, check for access closures. "Exercise an abundance of caution" near the river as banks are unstable. YNP Limited Opening: The Northern part of the Park is open to foot traffic except for specific local closures. The Old Yellowstone Trail between Gardiner and Mammoth is closed to bicycle and foot traffic. The North Loop between Norris, Mammoth, Tower and Canyon is open. The Upper Lamar Valley past Tower Junction will remain closed. A 23-mile stretch of the Beartooth Hwy from Cooke City to Ski Hill Parking Lot is now open. North and Northeast Entrances remain closed to vehicle traffic. See updates and restrictions at nps.gov/yell

Park County Road Repairs:

- Yankee Jim Canyon will be one-lane as road crews perform repairs from 7AM-7PM; expect 15 minute delays.
- Cinnabar Basin Road has flaggers as repairs are made from 7AM-4PM until FRIDAY, JULY 8th; the road is open to traffic.
- East River Rd. will also be under repair 5 miles north of the Hwy 89S intersection; it will remain open.

Federal Credit Union Mobile Branch: The Federal Credit Union will set up a mobile branch in the Baptist Church Parking lot on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 09:00am to 2:00pm.

Medical Needs: MedCor Mammoth Mobile Clinic will be operating an urgent care and walk-in medical clinic in Gardiner on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays from 8:30am to 5pm. The clinic will be located inside the Yellowstone National Park boundary across from Yellowstone Forever. The Mobile Clinic can also help set up telehealth appointments with Mammoth Clinic. Mammoth Clinic is open Monday through Thursday, 8:30am to 5pm. Call 307-344-7965 for questions or to set up an in-person or telehealth appointment. If you have a medical emergency, call 911.

Flood related refuse: Appliances without refrigeration can be disposed of in the designated "metal" greenboxes at any refuse station. Refrigeration units must be taken to Livingston City Transfer station. Natural river debris can be disposed of at the Chico Green boxes from 10am-4pm. There are extra green boxes temporarily at Point of Rocks (at the intersection of Hwy 89 South and Old Yellowstone Trail). Look for boxes dedicated to flood-related waste from inside residential or commercial structures, such as drywall, furniture, and carpeting, for example, NOT natural river debris. If the boxes are full, DO NOT place debris on the ground – please come back another time.
