MARIJUANA EXCISE TAX

Charter with Self-governing Powers with the Commission-Manager Plan of Government for the City of Livingston, Montana

- FOR adoption of a commission-manager form of government with a self-government charter for the City of Livingston

**GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS FOR THE  
RAILROAD CROSSING PROJECT  
(VOTE IN ONE OVAL)**

Shall the City Commission of the City of Livingston, Montana (the "City") be authorized to issue and sell general obligation bonds (the "Bonds") of the City in the original aggregate principal amount not to exceed Twenty Million and No/100 Dollars (\$20,000,000) for the construction and equipping of one (1) separated grade railroad crossing and related infrastructure and improvements such as water and sewer extensions and utility line relocation improvements to serve the proposed "Railroad Crossing Project." Proceeds from the Bonds will also pay the costs associated with the issuance and sale of the Bonds. The Bonds shall bear interest at a rate to be determined by the City Commission, payable semiannually for the term of the Bonds. The useful life of the Railroad Crossing Project to be financed by the Bonds shall not exceed twenty (20) years and shall be as determined by the City Commission based upon information from the most recent tax year, if the Bonds are issued, an additional annual tax that would be applied to a home with a market value of \$100,000 would be \$137.48 and the additional annual tax that would be applied to a home with a market value of \$200,000 would be \$274.96.]
